## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 120TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 16 1098, L.D. 1467, Bill, "An Act to Facilitate the Implementation of the Enhanced 9-1-1 Emergency System"

Amend the amendment on page 2 by striking out all of the 1st 20 paragraph (page 2, lines 2 to 4 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'Further amend the bill in section 5 by striking out all of subsection 1-B and inserting in its place the following:

26 '1-B. Statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge. The activities authorized under this chapter are funded through a special 28 statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge levied on each residential and business telephone exchange line, including private branch 30 exchange lines and Centrex lines, cellular or wireless telecommunications service subscribers and semipublic coin and 32 public access lines. The statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge may not be imposed on more than 25 lines or numbers per customer billing account. The statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge is 32# 50¢ per month 34 per line or number until June 30, 2002. On and after July 1, 2002, the statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge is 32¢ per month per line 36 or number. The statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge must be billed on a 38 monthly basis by each local exchange telephone utility or cellular or wireless telecommunications service provider and be 40 shown separately as a statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge on the customer's bill.' ## SENATE AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENT " $\hat{H}$ " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1098, L.D. 1467

2 Repealing the E-9-1-1 surcharge increase will reduce the dedicated funds that are collected by the Emergency Services Communication Bureau within the Department of Public Safety by 4 \$2,326,320 beginning in fiscal year 2002-03. Present contractual obligations require that this amount be paid to private service б providers thereby creating an annual deficit of this same amount beginning in fiscal year 2002-03. As a result, either the 8 program will have to significantly curtail expenditures, the E-9-1-1 surcharge will have to be increased or another funding 10 source will need to be used. 12

## **SUMMARY**

16 This amendment provides that the 50¢ surcharge reverts back to 32¢ on June 30, 2002 unless affirmative action is taken by the Legislature to change the law.
