Be	e it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3279-A is enacted to read:
<u>\$3</u>	279-A. Limited license to practice medicine; requirements; limitations of practice
<u>li</u>	1. Requirements. A person desiring to obtain a limited cense to practice medicine must:
	A. Submit to the board an application and a verified affidavit stating that the applicant has been licensed to practice medicine in this State or in any state or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia for at least 10 years and is retired from the practice of medicine and that the applicant's license was in good standing at retirement;
	B. Meet the requirements in section 3271 or 3275 and section 3280-A; and
	C. Notwithstanding sections 3271, 3275 and 3280-A, pay a fee of \$25 for a limited license or the renewal of a limited license.
	2. Continuing education. The board may not require more an 5 hours of continuing education annually as a requirement of newal under this section of a limited license.
<u>th</u> pr	3. Patients limited. A physician with a limited license der this section may provide services only in accordance with is subsection. A physician with a limited license may provide imary care and preventive health care services without mpensation. These services may be provided to family members
	at facilities described in Title 24, section 2904.
	4. Services limited. As used in this section, primary care d preventive health care services are limited to noninvasive produces and do not include obstatrical care or any specialized
<u>ca</u>	ocedures and do not include obstetrical care or any specialized re or treatment but may include injections, the suturing of nor lacerations and incisions of boils or superficial abscesses.
	SUMMARY
ph	This bill permits a retired physician to obtain a limited cense to practice medicine. A limited license allows a sysician to provide primary care and preventive health care rvices without compensation. These services may be provided to
fa	mily members or at certain facilities operated by nonprofit ganizations or the government.
