- 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. When making the appointments, the Speaker of the House shall give preference to members who serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation; and
 - Seven members appointed by the Governor as follows:

The Legislature will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$3,880 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members and other eligible members of the Commission to Study Ways to Improve Transportation for Senior Citizens and the Disabled and to print the required report.

The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the commission during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.'

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44 SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that in making the legislative appointments to the study commission, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall give preference to members of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation. The amendment reduces the number from 2 to one for representatives from local

- areas on aging, the Maine Council of Senior Citizens and school superintendents and adds a representative from the Maine Association of Pupil Transportation and the Maine Retirement
