rules associated with prior authorization for prescription drugs under the Medicaid program. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

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This estimate assumes that the prior authorization for prescription drugs program continues to operate during the rule-making process. The Governor's proposed "current services" budget proposal includes General Fund savings of \$3,127,703 and \$3,688,086 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively, associated with the prior authorization for prescription drugs program. A delay or discontinuance of this program would result in either a partial or total loss of these savings.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment is the minority report of the Committee on Health and Human Services. The amendment replaces the resolve and provides a new title. The amendment requires the Department of Human Services to adopt rules by November 1, 2001 regarding prior authorization for prescription drugs under the Medicaid program.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
