24	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the
26	following:

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32	7. Data collection; report. The board shall implement a system of record keeping, reporting, data collection and analysis that provides information on the quantity of product and brand
34	names of pesticides sold. The board, in cooperation with the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Service, shall study
36	ways to improve pesticide information data bases and to optimize the useful analysis of reported information.

over pesticide control matters. The report must contain sales information on quantities of pesticides sold listed by the common name of the active ingredient.

The board shall also include in the report aggregate data on 6 pesticide use based on reports submitted to the board by commercial applicators and other persons required to submit 8 reports under this chapter and rules adopted pursuant to this chapter. The board shall provide the data by sector of use 10 whenever possible. The board shall provide the data by category of pesticide, including data for herbicides, insecticides, fungicides and other major categories. In addition, the board 12 shall include in the report a summary of survey results or other 14 information published by the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Service or the United States Department of Agriculture 16 relating to pesticides use in the State.

- 18 The board shall develop a measure to estimate sales and types of pesticides commonly used by homeowners and track trends in the 20 quantities and types of pesticides used by homeowners.
- 22 The board shall provide historical information on pesticide use and sales in the report when the information available is 24 appropriate for comparison.
- 26 Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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This bill includes a one-time Other Special Revenue funds 8 allocation of \$30,000 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the Board of Pesticides Control within the Department of Agriculture, Food and 10 Rural Resources to provide funding for the costs of gathering certain information needed for a report to be submitted to the 12 Legislature. Currently, the board's annual expenses exceed the dedicated revenues collected by the board by approximately 14 \$28,000; the board depends on its balance brought forward at the end of each fiscal year to cover this shortfall. The additional allocation included in this bill will accelerate the decrease of 16 the board's balance brought forward.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the original bill. It requires a report be submitted to the Legislature by April 1, 2002 with information on pesticides sales and use. It directs the State Board of Pesticides Control to develop a measure to estimate homeowner use of pesticides. It makes a one-time allocation from Other Special Revenue funds for the State Board of Pesticides 28 Control for costs associated with collecting, analyzing and reporting on pesticides sales and use in Maine.

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This amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
