- Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1471-M, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1999, c. 724, §1, is further amended to read:
- 7. Data collection; annual report. The board shall implement a system of record keeping, reporting, data collection and analysis that provides information on the quantity of product and brand names of pesticides sold. The board, in cooperation with the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Service, shall study ways to improve pesticide information data bases and to optimize the useful analysis of reported information.
- 14 No--later-than-October-1,--1998,--and-each-year-thereafter,--the beard-shall-publish-an-annual-pesticides-report-centaining On January 15, 2002, and annually thereafter, the board shall submit 16 a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over board matters on the quantity of 18 product, sorted by the name and United States Environmental 20 Protection Agency registration number, of all pesticides sold in the prior year, with the data further sorted by sector of use 22 wherever possible, - except--that--the--pesticides--report--under--this subsection-is-not-required-in-the-years-2000-and-2001. 24 report shall provide a thorough review of all commercial and noncommercial uses of pesticide products in the State and shall 26 clearly identify the purpose of those uses, the environmental and economic impacts and benefits of those uses and the current safety precautions and restrictions required of users under all 28 applicable federal and state laws and regulations.

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Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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#### **SUMMARY**

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This bill amends the annual reporting requirements of the State Board of Pesticides Control to require that report to be submitted each January 15th to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over board matters. The contents of the report are expanded to include a thorough review of all commercial and noncommercial uses of pesticide products in the State and identification of the purpose of those uses, the environmental and economic impacts and benefits of those uses and the current safety precautions and restrictions required of users under all applicable federal and state laws and regulations. The bill also creates a Planning and Research Associate I position within the State Board of Pesticides Control to implement the record-keeping system and produce the annual report. That position is funded from the board's dedicated revenue account.
