An Act to Require Registration of Unlicensed Assistive Personnel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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#### Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1718 is enacted to read:

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#### §1718. Employment as unlicensed assistive staff person

Beginning October 1, 2001, a person may not be employed for 8 pay as an unlicensed assistive staff person, as defined in section 1812-G, subsection 2-A, paragraph B, in a home, assisted living center, residential care facility, hospital or other 10 health care setting licensed by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services who is not listed 12 in good standing on the Maine Registry of Certified Nursing Assistants and Unlicensed Assistive Personnel. This section does 14 not prohibit from employment an unlicensed assistive staff person 16 for whom a criminal history record check has been requested within 120 days of the beginning of employment. This provision 18 does not apply to the continued employment by a nursing facility, residential care facility, assisted living center, hospital or 20 home care agency of a person already employed by that facility or agency on October 1, 2001. A person who violates the provisions of this section commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture 22 of \$100 may be assessed. 24

The requirements of this section do not apply to a person employing an individual through a consumer-directed personal care assistance program.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1812-G, as amended by PL 1997, c. 465, §§1 30 and 2, is further amended to read:

### 32 §1812-G. Maine Registry of Certified Nursing Assistants and Unlicensed Assistive Personnel

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 Established. The Maine Registry of Certified Nursing
 Assistants and Unlicensed Assistive Personnel, referred to in this section as the "registry," is established in compliance with
 federal and state requirements. The Department of Human Services shall maintain the registry.

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Contents. The Maine--Registry--of--Certified--Nursing
 Assistants registry must contain a listing of nursing assistants who have successfully completed a nursing assistant training
 program, hold a certificate of training and meet the eligibility requirements established by the State Board of Nursing, and
 unlicensed assistive personnel. The listing must include, for any nursing assistant or unlicensed assistive personnel listed, a
 notation of:

A. Any criminal convictions, except for Class D and Class E
convictions over 10 years old that did not involve as a victim of the act a patient, client or resident of a health
care entity; and

6 Any specific documented findings by the state survey в. agency of abuse, neglect or misappropriation of property of a resident, client or patient. For purposes of this 8 section, "state survey agency" means the agency specified 10 under 42 United States Code, Sections 1395aa and 1396 responsible determining for whether institutions and agencies meet requirements for participation in the State's 12 Medicare and Medicaid programs -; and

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C. Identifying information, date of birth, social security number, employment history and training history.

18 <u>2-A. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.</u>

- 22 <u>A. "Certified nursing assistant" means an individual whose duties are assigned by a registered professional nurse and who:</u>
- 26 (1) Has successfully completed a training program or course with a curriculum prescribed by the State Board
   28 of Nursing, holds a certificate of training from that program or course and is listed on the registry; or
- (2) Was certified as a certified nursing assistant
   32 before September 29, 1987 and is listed on the registry.

34 "Unlicensed assistive staff person" means a person Β. employed for pay to provide hands-on assistance with activities of daily living to individuals in homes, assisted 36 living centers, residential care facilities, hospitals or 38 other health care settings licensed by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services. "Unlicensed assistive staff person" does not 40 include a certified nursing assistant employed as a certified nursing assistant or a person providing nursing 42 services in accordance with the practice of religious 44 principles or tenets of a church or denomination that relies upon prayer or spiritual means alone for healing.

Bligibility requirements for listing for nursing
 assistants. The State Board of Nursing shall adopt rules
 pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act defining
 eligibility requirements for listing on the Maine-Registry-ef

Certified-Nursing-Assistants registry, including rules regarding temporary listing of nursing assistants who have received 2 training in another jurisdiction. The rules must permit nursing 4 assistants to work under the supervision of a registered professional nurse in a facility providing assisted living services as defined in chapter 1665 and must recognize work in 6 those facilities for the purpose of qualifying for and continuing 8 listing on the registry. Rules adopted <u>pursuant to this</u> subsection regarding the work of nursing assistants in facilities providing assisted living services are routine technical rules as 10 defined by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

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4. Eligibility for listing in good standing. The
 14 department-shall-verify-the-oredentials-and-training-of-all
 certified-nursing-assistants. The following requirements apply
 16 for listing in good standing on the registry.

- 18A. For an applicant for listing on the registry or a person<br/>listed on the registry who is a certified nursing assistant,20the department shall verify the credentials and training,<br/>conduct criminal history record checks in accordance with22subsection 6 and investigate allegations of abuse, neglect<br/>or misappropriation of property in a health care setting.
  - B. For an applicant for listing on the registry or a person
     26 listed on the registry who is an unlicensed assistive staff person:
  - (1) Criminal history record checks must be conducted
     30 by the department in accordance with subsection 6; and
  - 32 (2) Allegations of abuse, neglect or misappropriation of property in a health care setting must be investigated and findings and determinations must be made:
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  - (a)By the Department of Mental Health, Mental38Retardation and Substance Abuse Services if the<br/>person is or was working or has applied to work in<br/>a setting in which services are funded by that<br/>department; and
  - (b) By the department if the person is or was
     working or has applied to work in a setting
     licensed by or in which services are funded by the
     department or is or was working or has applied to
     work in the home of an individual.
  - C. The department has access to all records and information 50 relevant to the investigation conducted by an employer or a

4	D. The following persons are ineligible for listing in good
6	standing on the registry:
8	(1) A person who has a substantiated, documented finding of abuse, neglect or misappropriation of
10	property of a resident, client or patient;
12	(2) A person who has been convicted of a crime that involves as a victim of the act a patient, client or resident of a health care entity;
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16	(3) A person who has been assessed a forfeiture under section 1718 and who has not paid that forfeiture; and
18	(4) A person who has been convicted of a crime that involves drug trafficking.
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22	<b>5. Verifying eligibility for employment.</b> A health care institution, <u>hospital</u> , facility or organization employing a certified nursing assistant shall, before hiring a certified
24	nursing assistant, verify with the Maine-Registry-of-Certified Nursing-Assistants registry that the certified nursing assistant
26	is listed in good standing on the Maine-Registryof-Certified Nursing-Assistants registry.
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30	Beginning October 1, 2001, a health care institution, hospital, facility or organization employing unlicensed assistive personnel shall, within 120 days of the beginning of employment of an
32	unlicensed assistive staff person, verify with the registry that the person is listed in good standing on the registry. The

36	requirements for the continued employment of unlicensed assistive personnel by a health care institution, hospital, facility or

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## SUMMARY

This bill adds unlicensed assistive personnel to the Maine Registry of Certified Nursing Assistants and renames the registry 4 Beginning October 1, 2001, the bill requires accordingly. unlicensed assistive personnel to be registered within 120 days 6 of being employed in a health care setting and declares a violation of this provision to be a civil violation for which a 8 forfeiture of \$100 may be assessed. The bill provides for 10 name-based criminal background checks beginning October 1, 2001 for new employees who are unlicensed assistive personnel until January 1, 2003, when the system will change to fingerprint-based 12 checks for unlicensed assistive personnel and certified nursing 14 assistants.

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
