SUMMARY

This amendment provides for an increase in the state minimum wage from \$5.15 per hour to \$5.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2002 and to \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003. The amendment also retains language in current law providing that the state minimum wage increases to conform to any increases in the federal minimum wage, up to a maximum of \$1.00 per hour above the specified state minimum. It deletes the section of the bill providing a tax credit for employers who provide health benefits and the section that increased the earned income credit.
