30	This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment eliminates the Health Careers Incentive Program and
32	changes the Health Workforce Retraining Program from a grant program available to eligible health care businesses and
34	organizations to a matching grant program that establishes education and training programs for eligible health care
36	businesses and organizations that provide dollar-for-dollar matching funds and meet eligibility criteria established by rules
38	of the Maine Technical College System. The amendment also provides a one-time appropriation of \$100,000 in fiscal year
40	2001-02 to establish the Health Workforce Retraining Program.
