COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 506, L.D. 1593

SUMMARY

4 This amendment is a minority report. It reduces the amount of the bond issue from \$20,000,000 to \$10,000,000. The funds will be used to provide capital subsidies for a range of housing statewide serving low-income mental health services consumers as well as to provide transitional and permanent housing for people who are homeless.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
