An Act to Expand Family Life Education in Maine Schools.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1910 is enacted to read: 4 §1910. Family life education 6 1. Definition. For the purposes of this section, 8 "comprehensive family life education" means education of students in kindergarten to grade 12 regarding human development and sexuality, including education on family planning and sexually 10 transmitted diseases, that is medically accurate and 12 age-appropriate; that respects community values and encourages parental communication; that develops skills in communication, decision-making and conflict resolution; that contributes to 14 healthy relationships; that promotes responsible sexual behavior and addresses abstinence and the use of contraception; that 16 promotes individual responsibility and involvement regarding 18 sexuality; and that teaches skills for responsible decision-making regarding sexuality. 20 2. Comprehensive family life education. The commissioner shall provide effective, comprehensive family life education for 22 students in kindergarten to grade 12. In providing such education, the commissioner shall contract with local family 24 planning programs, including, but not limited to, the Family Planning Association of Maine or its successor organization, to 26 provide: 28 A. Training for teachers, parents and community members in 30 the development and implementation of a family life education curriculum and in planning for an evaluation 32 component; 34 B. Hiring resource staff persons to provide expert training, curriculum development, implementation and evaluation services on a statewide basis; 36 38 C. Funding to promote and coordinate community and youth forums in communities identified as having high needs; 40 D. Funding for training across the State, including issue 42 management and policy development training for school boards, superintendents, principals and administrators; and 44 E. Funding for grants to school-based family life education 46 programs to recognize outstanding performance and share strategies for success. 48 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated 50 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
