Resolve, to Establish a Task Force to Study Parenting Alienation Syndrome and Related Issues.

Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Study Parenting Alienation Syndrome and Related Issues, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established; and be it further Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of the following 11 members: Two members of the Senate, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House; 10 12 2. Two members from the House of Representatives, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 14 House; 16 One member who belongs to a statewide organization representing parents, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House; 18 20 One quardian ad litem, appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court; 22 One member from the Maine Coalition to End Domestic Violence, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and 24 the Speaker of the House; 26 One member who represents the Judicial Branch, appointed 28 by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judical Court; 30 One child protective caseworker, appointed by the Commissioner of Human Services: 32 8. The Attorney General, or the Attorney 34 designee; and 36 The Commissioner of Human Services or the commissioner's designee; and be it further 38 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the task force and the first named House 40 of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force; and be it further 42 44 Appointments: meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. 46 The Executive Director of the Legislative appointing Council must be notified by all authorities once the selections have been made. 48 When the

4	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study
6	parenting alienation syndrome and related issues.
8	 In conducting the study, the task force shall examine the following topics:
10	A. Caseloads for Department of Human Services case workers, the court system and guardians ad litem;
12	B. Delays in investigations of a custodial parent;
14	C. Evasion by the custodial parent of investigation of that

18	D. Custody issues in domestic violence situations.
20	2. In examining these topics, the task force may:
22	A. Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons;

42	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That upon approval of the
44	Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and

48	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the task
50	force who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3,

section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Other members of the task force who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task force exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on the task force's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes a task force to study parent alienation syndrome and related issues of custodial parents, the Department of Human Services and domestic violence.
