Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, this legislation establishes the Task Force to 6 Examine Health Care Delivery Systems within the State; and 8 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative 10 session; and 12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore, be it 18 Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Examine Health Care Delivery Systems within the State, referred 20 to in this resolve as the "task force," is established; and be it further 22 Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force 24 consists of the following 10 members: 26 Two members of the Senate, one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance and one of 28 whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services, appointed by the President of the Senate; 30 Three members from the House of Representatives, 2 of 32 whom are members of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance and one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing 34 Committee on Health and Human Services, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 36 3. One member who is a hospital administrator, appointed by 38 the Speaker of the House; 40 One member who belongs to a statewide organization representing physicians, appointed by the President of the Senate; 42 One patient advocate, appointed by the Speaker of the 44 House: 46 6. The Commissioner of Human Services or the commissioner's designee; and 48

4	Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the task force and the first named House
6	of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force;
8	and be it further
10	Sec. 4. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the
12	effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing
12	authorities once the selections have been made. When the
14	appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the task force shall call and convene the first meeting of the task
16	force no later than 10 days after all members have been appointed; and be it further
18	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study
20	health care delivery systems within the State.
22	1. In conducting the study, the task force shall examine at
24	least the following topics:
26	A. Ways to avoid duplication;
	B. Identification of waste;
28	C. Reduction of paperwork;
30	D. Standardized billing systems;
32	E. Hospital costs;
34	F. The certificate of need process;
36	r. The Certificate of need process;
38	G. Prescription drugs; and
30	H. The feasibility of a pilot program to implement the
40	recommendations of the task force.
42	2. In examining these topics, the task force may:
44	A. Hold informational sessions for discussions with
46	knowledgeable persons;
	B. Conduct, summarize and analyze the results of a
48	literature search;

2	C. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;
4	D. Procure and analyze relevant data;
6	E. Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal questions within the scope of the study;

10	F. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to issues within the scope of the study;
12	G. Invite experts to assist the task force or a
14	subcommittee to carry out the purposes of this resolve; and
16	H. Form subcommittees of no more than 5 members to focus on a problem or issue identified by the task force; and be it

20	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
22	shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further

26	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the task force who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per
20	diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section
28	2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Other
30	members of the task force who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are
32	entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further
34	
36	Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later
38	than January 15, 2002. The chairs of the task force shall report
40	the findings of the task force to a joint session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002. If the task force
42	requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension;

44	Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force,
46	with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the
48	task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the
50	Legislative Council for approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task
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	force exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task
2	force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status
4	report on the task force's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.
6	
	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
8	preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

## **SUMMARY**

This resolve establishes the Task Force to Examine Health Care Delivery Systems within the State. The task force shall submit a report and any necessary implementing legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature and the chairs of the task force shall report the findings of the task force to a joint session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002.
