- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the working group, in carrying out the purposes of this resolve, shall perform the following duties:
- Identify specific geographic areas where advanced
 telecommunications capability is deployed at a significantly lower rate than the rest of the State;

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the working group shall report
its findings and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee
on Business and Economic Development no later than December 31,
2001. The Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic
Development may report out legislation pursuant to this resolve

Sec. 8. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the advisory panel, with assistance from the advisory panel staff, shall 38 administer the advisory panel's budget. The Legislature will require an additional General Fund 36 appropriation of \$1,680 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members of the advisory panel 38 established to provide information and advice to the Telecommunications Working Group.

 panel can be absorbed by the affected state departments and
 44 agencies utilizing existing budgeted resources.'
