	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, information technology infrastructure is vital to
6	the economic well-being of the State; and
8	Whereas, the rural areas of the State, most in need of
10	economic development, tend to be the farthest behind in information technology infrastructure; and
12	Whereas, the advance of information technology is moving faster than ever before and can outpace the capabilities of
14	existing infrastructure in even a matter of months; and
16	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
18	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
20	safety; now, therefore, be it
22	Sec. 1. Maine Science and Technology Foundation to determine the physical condition of information technology infrastructure in the State.
24	Resolved: That the Maine Science and Technology Foundation shall
26	determine the physical condition of the information technology infrastructure in the State; and be it further
28	Sec. 2. Duties. Resolved: That the Maine Science and Technology Foundation, in carrying out the purposes of this
30	resolve, shall perform the following duties:
32	1. Draft a request for information on information technology infrastructure in the State and disseminate this
34	request to and encourage a response from telecommunications
36	service providers, Internet service providers, wireless service providers and digital satellite and cable television companies;
38	2. Identify specific geographic areas where advanced telecommunications capability is deployed at a significantly
40	lower rate than the rest of the State; and
42	3. Study the following:
44	A. The investment in telecommunications facilities with advanced capabilities in rural areas, including an
46	assessment of the various levels of capability deployed
48	under different technologies, the bandwidth capabilities of the deployment and whether or not comparable bandwidth is deployed consistently;
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- B. The availability of telecommunications backbone networks and "last mile" facilities with advanced capability in rural areas;
- 6 C. The capability of various technological enhancements to existing wired and wireless networks to provide "last mile" 8 advanced telecommunications capability in rural areas; and
- D. The feasibility of various technological alternatives to provide "last mile" advanced telecommunications capability in rural areas.
- 14 The Maine Science and Technology Foundation may employ outside consultants and experts to assist in carrying out the duties The Public Utilities Commission, 16 listed in this section. Department of Education, Department of Economic and Community 18 Development, Public Advocate's Office, University of System, Maine Technical College System, Executive Department, State Planning Office and Department of Administrative and 20 Financial Services, Bureau of Information Services, Office of Geographic Information Systems shall cooperate with the Maine 22 Science and Technology Foundation in carrying out the duties listed in this section; and be it further 24
  - Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the Maine Science and Technology Foundation shall report its recommendations, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development no later than December 31, 2001. The Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development may report out legislation pursuant to this resolve to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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## **SUMMARY**

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This resolve directs the Maine Science and Technology Foundation, along with comments from information technology interests and cooperation from various other agencies of the State, to determine the physical condition of the information technology infrastructure in the State, in particular in rural areas, and to report its recommendations, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Legislature.
