Maine Small Business Commission established б 8 The Maine Small Business Commission is established as an independent commission within the department to evaluate and coordinate small business and entrepreneurial programs, contract 10 with the administrative unit and exercise other powers and 12 responsibilities as provided in this chapter. Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §13033, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 875, Pt. L, 14 S2 and 4, is amended to read: 16 §13033. SUMMARY

This bill requires the Maine Small Business Commission to 48 evaluate entrepreneurial programs as part of their duties and requires the commission to advise the Commissioner of Economic 50 and Community Development to assist in developing and implementing statewide strategies and policies as they relate to
encouraging economic development by developing entrepreneurial businesses around the State. The bill also changes the number of
members of the commission from 3 to 7.
