	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
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	Whereas, the Legislature created the Emergency Medical
6	Services Act of 1982 to promote and provide for a comprehensive emergency medical services system to ensure optimum patient care
8	with standards for all providers; and
10	Whereas, the stated mission of the Act is to develop resources to improve the professional capabilities of team
12	members and to make emergency medical services work safe,
	healthful and satisfying; and

	Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 89,
16	subsection 2 sets the regional councils as the primary planning and operational units of the statewide emergency medical services

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Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Emergency Medical Services System, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 13 members:

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Three Senators, one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the President of the Senate;

- 2. Four members of the House of Representatives one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
  - 3. One member of the Emergency Medical Services' Board, to be appointed by the Governor;

4. Two representatives of the 6 designated regional emergency medical services councils, appointed by the Governor from among these councils;

5. The Commissioner of Public Safety or the commissioner's designee; and

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- 18 6. Two members of the general public, appointed by the Governor; and be it further
  - Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
    - Appointments: meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council notified must be by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. When appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after the appointments are made; and be it further
    - Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the emergency medical services system. In conducting the study, the commission shall examine the needs, design and structure of the emergency medical services system in Maine.

In examining this topic, the commission may:

- Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons;
- 2. Conduct, summarize and analyze the results of a literature search;
- 3. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;

26	Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit
	its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation,
28	to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later
	than February 1, 2002. If the commission requires a limited
30	extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the
	Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it

14	Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission,
34	with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the
36	commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the
, 0	commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the
38	Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur
	expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its
10	approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive
_	Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the
12	commission chairs and staff with a status report on the
	commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available
14	funds.
16	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
	preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
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SUMMARY -

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This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Emergency Medical Services System.
