20	referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature			
22	to be submitted to the voters in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is			
24	\$121,392. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$8,000.			
26	If approved by the voters, the total cost of this bond issue is estimated to be \$7,122,525 with principal payments of			
28	\$5,750,000 and interest payments of approximately \$1,372,525.

34	This is the minority report. It reduces the size of the bond issue from \$17,200,000 to \$5,750,000 by:

38	 Eliminating \$1,200,000 for the remediation of solid waste landfills; 			
40	2. Eliminating \$1,500,000 for the removal and replacement			
42	of failing septic systems;			
16	3. Eliminating \$5,500,000 in grants to construct water

46	4. Eliminating \$1,000,000 to remove overboard discharges;
