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SENATE AMENDMENT "*A*" to H.P. 1224, L.D. 1665, Bill, "An Act to Further Reduce Mercury Emissions from Consumer Products"

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Amend the bill in section 3 in that part designated "~~S1661-B.~~" in the first indented paragraph in the 7th line (page 3, line 25 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "~~1,000,000,000,000.~~" the following: 'The certificate must be based on representative samples of the product as determined in consultation with the hospital and, at a minimum, an annual analysis of the product.'

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Further amend the bill in section 3 in that part designated "~~S1661-B.~~" by striking out all of the 2nd indented paragraph (page 3, lines 34 to 41 in L.D.)

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**SUMMARY**

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This amendment reduces the potential cost of complying with the disclosure requirement by removing the requirement to analyze each batch or lot of formulated products for mercury content and substituting a requirement to analyze the products at least annually.
