26	'Mandate preamble. This measure requires one or more local units of government to expand or modify activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues but does
28	not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures. Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21,
30	two thirds of all of the members elected to each House have determined it necessary to enact this measure.'

34	Further amend the bill by striking out all of Part C.
36	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

••	This bill requires local units of government to develop

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1234, L.D. 1681

The additional costs associated with developing these same information practices and policies, and including an analysis of the practices in the agency review under the State Government Evaluation Act can be absorbed by state departments and agencies utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment strikes the Part of the bill creating a commission to review governmental information policy and adds a mandate preamble and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
