This bill requires that municipalities with a population greater than 100 open polling places at 7 a.m. on election day and municipalities with a population less than 100 open polling places no later than 10 a.m. The additional costs of this state mandate can not be determined at this time. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble, the 2/3 vote of all members elected to each House exempts the State from the constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local costs.'

This amendment strikes all of the original bill except for the requirement that all polling places open no later than 7 a.m. Under this amendment municipalities with a population of less than 100 may open their polls at 10 a.m. The amendment also adds a mandate preamble and a fiscal note to the bill.
