### An Act to Amend the Laws Governing Elections.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §161, sub-§6** is enacted to read:

6 **6. Copies of list to be furnished to Secretary of State.**  
7 The registrar shall send a copy of the voting list to the  
8 Secretary of State upon request of the Secretary of State  
9 pursuant to section 168.

10 **Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §168** is enacted to read:

12 **§168. Central voting list for State**

14 The Secretary of State shall maintain a central  
15 comprehensive voting list for the State that includes the names  
16 and addresses of all residents registered to vote. The Secretary  
17 of State shall update the list at least once a year by requesting  
18 the voting list from the registrar of every municipality in the  
19 State.

20 **Sec. 3. 21-A MRSA §505, sub-§7**, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 459,  
22 §34, is amended to read:

24 **7. Return of votes cast.** Report the return of votes cast  
25 to the Secretary of State; and

26 **Sec. 4. 21-A MRSA §505, sub-§7-A** is enacted to read:

28 **7-A. Training.** Attend a training session that is approved  
30 by the Secretary of State at least once every 2 years in regard  
31 to the conduct of elections. The clerk or the clerk's designee  
32 shall attend the training session; and

34 **Sec. 5. 21-A MRSA §626, sub-§1**, as amended by PL 1997, c. 436,  
36 §88, is further amended to read:

38 **1. Opening time flexible.** The polls must be opened no  
39 ~~earlier than 6 a.m.~~ and no later than 9 7 a.m. on election day;  
40 except that in municipalities with a population of less than  
41 4,000 100, the polls must be opened no later than 10:00 a.m. on  
42 election day. The municipal officers of each municipality shall  
determine the time of opening the polls within these limits.

44 **SUMMARY**

46 This bill requires the Secretary of State to maintain a  
48 central voting list for the State and to update the list at least  
once a year by requesting the voting list from the registrar of  
50 every municipality in the State. This bill also requires a

2 registrar to furnish the voting list for the registrar's  
3 municipality to the Secretary of State upon request from the  
4 Secretary of State.

5 This bill requires each municipal clerk or the clerk's  
6 designee to attend a training session that is approved by the  
7 Secretary of State at least once every 2 years in regard to the  
8 conduct of elections.

9 This bill requires polls to be opened no later than 7 a.m.  
10 on election days, except that in a municipality with a population  
11 of less than 100, the polls must be opened no later than 10 a.m.
