Every totally or partially blind or otherwise physically disabled person has the right to be accompanied by a quide or personal care doq, especially trained 8 for the purpose, in any of the places listed in subsection 2 10 without being required to pay an extra charge for the guide or personal care dog if the requirements of this subsection are met; however, the person is liable for any damage done to the premises 12 or facilities by such doq. 14 In order to qualify for the right to be accompanied by a guide or 16 personal care dog as provided in this subsection, a person must possess the following: 18 A. Written certification from a physician that that person 20 needs the assistance of a guide or personal care dog; and B. Written certification from the person or organization 22 that trained the guide or personal care dog used by that 24 person that that dog is trained as a guide or personal care doq. 26 Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §1312, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1997, c. 611, §3, is further amended to read: 28 30 Housing accommodations; persons with guide or personal care animals. Every blind or visually handicapped or otherwise 32 physically disabled individual who has a sight-assistance or assistance animal, such as a quide or personal care dog, is entitled to full and equal access to all housing accommodations 34 provided for in this section if the requirements of this 36 subsection are met. Blind or visually impaired or otherwise physically disabled individuals may not be required to pay extra 38 compensation to keep sight-assistance or personal care animals. A blind or visually impaired or otherwise physically disabled person is liable for any damages done to the premises by the 40 animal. 42

In order to qualify for the right to be accompanied by a guide or personal care animal as provided in this subsection, a person 44 must possess the following:
