30	This bill may reduce prosecutions for Class E crimes. If the number of jail sentences is reduced, the savings to the

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	This amendment provides for staggered terms for members of the whitewater guides advisory board so that not all terms expire

wildlife violations. Without this amer

wildlife violations. Without this amendment, these inconsistencies would remain in law during the summer's boating and all-terrain vehicle season. The amendment also repeals the requirement that the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife adopt by rule a schedule of fines for the improper operation of a

6 fishway.

This amendment also removes the enforcement of the laws concerning sales of snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles from the jurisdiction of the game wardens and places the provisions with the franchise laws.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
