2. Six members appointed by the Speaker of the House as follows:

A. Three members of the House of Representatives, at least one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and at least one of whom is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor;

- B. Two representatives of persons who are blind or visually impaired, one from a list provided by the American Council of the Blind of Maine and one from a list provided by the National Federation of the Blind, Maine Chapter; and
- C. One member of the State Rehabilitation Council created to comply with 29 United States Code, Section 725 with respect to general vocational rehabilitation services;
- 3. The Commissioner of Labor or the commissioner's designee; and
- 26 4. The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's designee; and be it further
  - Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
  - Sec. 4. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after the appointments are made; and be it further
  - Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the most effective administrative structure for providing services to persons who are blind or visually impaired. In conducting the study, the commission shall:
    - Review state and federal laws and funding sources for services to the blind and visually impaired;

**Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

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Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature before December 1, 2001. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further

Sec. 10. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

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## **SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill. It changes the bill to a resolve creating the Commission to Study the Administrative Structure for Providing Services to the Blind and Visually Impaired. Members of the commission include Legislators, representatives of persons who are blind or visually impaired, a member of the State Rehabilitation Council and representatives of the Department of Labor and the Department of Education. The commission is required to report its findings, recommendations and any recommended legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature before December 1, 2001. The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
