An Act to Establish for an Additional Two Years the Commission to Study the Needs and Opportunities Associated with the Production of Salmonid Sport Fish in Maine.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 119th Legislature originally established the
Commission to Study the Needs and Opportunities Associated with
the Production of Salmonid Sport Fish in Maine in Resolve 1999,
chapter 82; and

10 Whereas, the 119th Legislature appropriated \$500,000 to be spent over the current biennium for engineering design for the 12 Embden Hatchery and a statewide assessment of all other hatchery facilities; and

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Whereas, authorization of this commission for an additional 2-year period is essential to complete the original duties assigned to the commission and to provide ongoing legislative policy guidance on the expenditures of those funds appropriated for engineering design for the Embden Hatchery and a statewide assessment of all other hatchery facilities; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

28 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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PART A

32 Sec. A-1. 12 MRSA §7671-A is enacted to read:

34 §7671-A. Fish hatchery maintenance fund

36 The fish hatchery maintenance fund, referred to in this section as the "fund," is established in the department as a nonlapsing fund to be used by the commissioner to fund or assist 38 in funding maintenance, repair and capital improvements at fish 40 hatcheries and feeding stations owned by the State. The fund may not be used to fund personnel services costs or general operating 42 costs of a fish hatchery. The commissioner may accept and deposit into the fund any monetary gifts, donations or other contributions from public or private sources and must use that 44 money for the purposes specified in this section. 46

Sec. A-2. Report. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife no later than January 15, 2002 with recommendations on sources of revenues for the fish hatchery

maintenance fund established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7671-A to be used to fund maintenance, repair 2 capital improvements at fish hatcheries and feeding and stations. Those recommendations must include draft proposals for 4 the any statutory enactments necessary to implement 6 commissioner's recommendations.

8 Sec. A-3. Carrying balances - Inland Fisheries and Wildlife program. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, \$100,000 is transferred from the Carrying Balances - Inland Fisheries and 10 program to fish Wildlife the hatchery maintenance fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 12 7671-A to be used for the purposes specified in that section. This transfer must be made not later than 30 days after the 14 effective date of this Act. 16

Sec. A-4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Part. 18

The Commission to Study the 18 and Opportunities Associated with the Production of Needs 20 Salmonid Sport Fish in Maine, referred to in this Part as the "commission," is established. 22 Sec. B-2. Commission membership; appointed ad hoc and ex officio 24 The commission consists of appointed members members. as follows: 26 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, all 28 members appointed pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 82, including legislative members, whether or not members of the 120th 30 Legislature, are members of this commission; The President of the Senate shall appoint 2 members of 32 2. Senate to the commission. The first Senator appointed the 34 pursuant to this subsection is the Senate chair of the commission. B-3. Duties. 46 The commission shall complete all duties 82 and shall provide prescribed in Resolve 1999, chapter 48 oversight and policy guidance to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife with respect to the expenditure of funds appropriated by the 119th Legislature in Public Law 1999, chapter 50

731, Part A, section 1 and Part HHHH, section 1, for engineering design for the Embden Hatchery and a statewide assessment of all other hatchery facilities. In addition, the commission shall:

 Continue to work with the Department of Inland Fisheries
 and Wildlife and the department's consultant to continue the work of evaluating the effluent characteristics of fish hatcheries,
 including private fish hatcheries, with the purpose of ensuring that the state fish hatcheries will be able to comply with
 licensed effluent discharge standards within 3 years and to obtain information relevant to discussions of discharge license
 standards for unlicensed private fish hatcheries;

Set statewide production goals for the number, size and species mix of recreational sport fish over a 15- to 20-year
 planning horizon;

Determine how to meet those production goals in the most cost-effective manner by evaluating all production options,
 including options for investing in cost-effective upgrades to existing state-owned facilities to produce more fish, closing
 noneconomic state-owned facilities and building new capacity in other locations in the State and purchasing fish from privately
 owned hatcheries; and

4. Within existing budgeted resources, undertake any studies or other activities as are necessary to complete the tasks outlined in this section.

30 Sec. B-4. Staff assistance. The commission shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council.

Sec. B-5. Compensation. The legislative members and ad hoc 34 members are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement 36 necessary expenses incurred for their attendance for at authorized meetings of the commission that occur on days the Legislature is not in session. Other members of the commission 38 who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other 40 entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance 42 at authorized meetings.

44 Sec. B-6. Report. The commission shall submit an interim report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and 46 Wildlife no later than December 1, 2001 and a final report to that same committee no later than October 31, 2002.

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Sec. B-7. Unexpended balances carried forward. Unexpended funds appropriated by Public Law 1999, chapter 731, Part A, section 1 and Part HHHH, section 1, to the Department of Inland
Fisheries and Wildlife, Fisheries and Hatcheries Operations, are carried forward to fiscal year 2001-02 and must be used for the purposes originally appropriated. Those funds may not be encumbered for any purpose without prior consultation with the commission.

- **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
 - SUMMARY

14 Part A of this bill creates a fish hatchery maintenance fund within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to be used 16 by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to fund or assist in funding maintenance, repair or capital improvements at fish hatcheries and feeding stations owned by the State. 18 The fund may not be used to fund personnel services costs or general 20 operating costs of a fish hatchery. The fund is initially capitalized by a \$100,000 transfer from the department's carrying The commissioner is directed to report back to the 22 account. Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by 24 January 15, 2002 with recommendations on mechanisms to raise revenue for the fund.

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Part A also reallocates \$182,000 from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to the fish hatchery study commission to allow the commission to hire consulting engineers to assist in the design and assessment of statewide fish hatchery production and distribution needs and for the per diem expenses of 4 annual meetings of the commission. Those funds are part of a \$500,000 appropriation originally made to the department in 200 for similar purposes.

Part B of this bill authorizes for an additional 2 years a study commission originally established by the 119th Legislature
by Resolve 1999, chapter 82. The purpose of this commission is to study the needs and opportunities associated with the
production of salmonid sport fish in this State.

Part B appoints all the members of the commission originally appointed in 1999, except that it requires the President of the
Senate to appoint 2 additional members of the Senate and requires the Governor to fill 2 vacancies among public members appointed
by the Governor in 1999.

48 Part B also carries forward into fiscal year 2001-02 all unexpended balances appropriated to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for fiscal year 2000-01 for fish hatchery engineering work.

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
