38	to qualify for licensure as a forester or intern forester. These costs can be absorbed within the board's existing budgeted

44	SUMMARY

This amendment amends the original bill by prohibiting the Board of Licensure of Foresters from adopting rules governing forest practices. It also authorizes the board to grant a variance to an applicant for an intern forester license who does not hold a college degree. The amendment requires the board to adopt rules for the granting of a variance and designates those

rules as major substantive rules pursuant to the Maine Revised

Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. The amendment also establishes that the rules adopted by the board governing the registration of foresters who supervise intern foresters are major substantive rules. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
