42	appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this Act. The appointing authorities shall
44	notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When the appointment of all members

48	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study

issues relating to the Internet, including the following:
