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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

This bill authorizes the sale of the Caribou Armory and the Fort Fairfield Armory in accordance with established procedures. The sale of these 2 armories will result in increased dedicated revenues to the Capital Repair Account established in the Military Bureau. The amount of revenue can not be determined at this time.

This bill also eliminates the requirement that the Military Bureau pay the spouse or child of a veteran a maximum of \$300 per year toward the cost of higher education and adds the requirement that State-supported postsecondary vocational schools or institutions of collegiate grade waive mandatory fees and lab fees for spouses and children of veterans. The Maine Technical College System estimates the loss of dedicated revenue from student tuition as a result of these measures to be approximately \$60,500 per year. This estimate is based on an average mandatory course and lab fee of \$800 per year per student and an estimated 55 dependents enrolled. The total loss of revenue may be higher or lower depending on the actual fees waived and the number of dependents enrolled.

The University of Maine System estimates the loss of dedicated revenue from student tuition as a result of waiving the cost of mandatory course and lab fees to be approximately \$168,000 annually. This estimate is based on the assumption that 254 students, which is the number of students who had their tuition waived under this program in fiscal year 2000-01, would have their mandatory course and lab fees waived. The total loss of revenue to the University of Maine will be higher or lower depending on the actual number of dependents enrolled and the actual fees waived.

The Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management will incur some minor additional costs for the increased number of veterans who will be eligible for burial in veterans cemeteries. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment specifies that the sale of the Caribou Armory must be at market value. Current law states that a veteran is

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eligible for burial in the veterans' cemetery if he or she was a resident of the State at the time of entering military service or at the time of death. This requirement is repealed by this amendment. The amendment also authorizes the Governor to enter into an agreement with the Federal Emergency Management Agency for debris removal financial assistance. Under this agreement the Governor is authorized to indemnify the Federal Government against any claim arising from such removal as required by federal law. The amendment also makes several technical changes to the bill and adds a fiscal note to the bill.
