COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "*A*" to S.P. 581, L.D. 1759, Bill, "An Act To Change the Membership of Certain Boards to Include The Department of Administrative and Financial Services"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'An Act to Define the Responsibilities of the Chief Information Officer and to Make Membership Changes on Technical Boards'**

Further amend the bill in section 14 in that part designated "§1973." in subsection 2 in paragraph A in the 3rd line (page 10, line 11 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "to all branches" and inserting in its place the following: 'for the executive branch'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment changes the title of the bill and clarifies that the responsibilities of the chief information officer with respect to information technology advocacy do not extend to the legislative and judicial branches of State Government. The chief information officer acts as a liaison to the judicial and legislative branches for information technology purposes.
