SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1295, L.D. 1765, Bill, "An Act to Authorize Release of Certain Information Pertaining to the Certification, Authorization and Approval of Educational Personnel"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the first paragraph after the title (page 1, lines 24 to 30 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 3-A in paragraph B in subparagraph 4 in the first line (page 2, line 33 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "of individuals" and inserting in its place the following: "by category that represents the number of educational personnel applicants who have been fingerprinted; and the aggregate number by category that represents the sum total of educational personnel applicants" '

Further amend the amendment by inserting after the 2nd paragraph the following:

'Further amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 3-A in paragraph B in subparagraph 4 in the last line (page 1, line 37 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "check," the following: "For purposes of providing information by category, the commissioner shall separate criminal record information into at least the following categories: crimes or offenses when the victims were children; drug law violations; murder or homicide; and other offenses." '

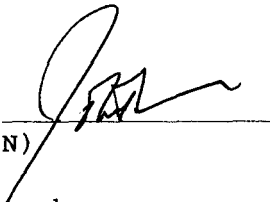
