2 SUMMARY

This amendment changes the membership of the Commission to Develop a Comprehensive Plan to Reduce Toxic Emissions and Expand Plastics Recycling by replacing a member from the Maine Chamber of Commerce with a representative of the plastics industry and 8 adding a representative of the Maine Resource Association and a representative of the Maine Municipal Association. The amendment also deletes the task of studying the 10 feasibility of banning the incineration of polyvinyl chloride and 12 other plastics and replaces it with the task of studying the feasibility of reducing the toxicity of waste, including the 14 diversion of polyvinyl chloride from incineration. It also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.
