Resolve, to Create a Study Commission to Develop a Comprehensive Plan to Reduce Toxic Emissions and Expand Plastics Recycling.

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Develop a Comprehensive Plan to Reduce Toxic Emissions and Expand Plastics Recycling, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Resolved: That the commission consists of 13 members:

Sec. 2. Commission membership; appointed and ex officio members.

1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate. One member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources and one member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development. The first appointed member of the Senate is the Senate chair of the commission;

 Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House. One member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources and one member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development. The first appointed member of the House is the House chair of the commission;

Three members ex-officio members: the Director of the
State Planning Office or the director's designee, the
Commissioner of Environmental Protection or the commissioner's
designee and the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural
Resources or the commissioner's designee; and

4. Six persons appointed by the Governor as follows:

3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** 44 Sec. That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days after the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall 46 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the appointments have been made. The Executive Director of the 48 Legislative Council shall notify the chairs when all appointments 50 have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission within 30 days after 52 all appointments have been made; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

4 1. Undertake an analysis of plastics generation by type and current method of disposal;

2. Study the feasibility of expanding the State's bottle include containers made of high density 8 deposit laws to polyethylene, polyethylene-terethphalate or polyvinyl chloride;

- Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 20 report, together with any recommended implementing its legislation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 22 having jurisdiction over natural resources matters no later than The 24 December 1, 2002. joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters may introduce legislation during the First Regular Session of the 26 121st Legislature; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the 30 Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide staffing assistance to the commission. The Office 32 of Fiscal and Program Review and state agencies shall also provide assistance as requested by the commission; and be it further 34

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: 36 That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 38 Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other 40 necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the 44 commission's budget. The commission may not incur expenses exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, 46 the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission and its staff with a status report on the 48 commission's budget, expenditures incurred and remaining available funds. 50

SUMMARY

This resolve creates the Commission to Develop a Comprehensive Plan to Reduce Toxic Emissions and Expand Plastics 4 Recycling to undertake an analysis of plastics generation by type 6 and current method of disposal; study the feasibility of expanding the State's bottle deposit laws to include containers 8 made of high density polyethylene, polyethylene-terethphalate or polyvinyl chloride; study the feasibility of banning the incineration of polyvinyl chloride and other plastics; recommend 10 market-based recycling opportunities for plastics; and recommend incentives for expanded in-state end uses for plastics. 12
