If an extension of the reporting 32 deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for 34 staff services. 36 The additional costs associated with membership on the Blue Ribbon Commission on Postsecondary Educational Attainment can be 38 absorbed by the Department of Education, the Board of Trustees of 40 the Maine Technical College System, the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy and the 42 Department of Economic and Community Development utilizing existing budgeted resources.' 44 46 **SUMMARY** 48 This amendment corrects the title of the resolve to accurately state the name of the blue ribbon commission created 50 by the resolve.

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## **COMMITTEE AMENDMENT**

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 616, L.D. 1797

This amendment revises the membership of the Blue Ribbon 2 Commission on Postsecondary Educational Attainment. It decreases the number of Senate and House members to 2 each, and requires 4 the President and the Speaker, when making the appointments, to give preference to members of the Joint Standing Committee on б Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee It also adds 8 on Business and Economic Development. the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development or the commissioner's designee and a member of a statewide association 10 of school guidance counselors appointed by the Governor. 12

The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.

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
