| | Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not |

| 2 | become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and |
| 4 | Whereas, it is necessary that this legislation take effect |
| 6 | before the 90-day period so that salvage activities may begin immediately; and |
| 8 | Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts |
| 10 | create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately |
| 12 | necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, |
| 14 | Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: |
| 16 | Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §1867, sub-§1, ¶A-1 is enacted to read: |
| 20 | A-1. "Pulpwood" means a portion of a tree intended for use in the paper-making process. |
| 22 | Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §1867, sub-§1, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 678, §13, is amended to read: |
| 24 26 | B. "Salvage" means any activity involved in the retrieval of sunken logs or pulpwood from submerged land. |
| 28 | Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §1867, sub-§6 is enacted to read: |
| 30 | 6. Pulpwood salvage exemption. A person who has been granted a charter or other specific authorization by the |
| 32 | Legislature prior to June 30, 1998 to erect and maintain piers and booms to collect and store pulpwood in waters over submerged |
| 34 | lands may salvage the pulpwood stored in compliance with that charter and is exempt from subsections 3, 4 and 5 of this |
| 36 | section, as long as: |
| 38 | A. The person provides documentation satisfactory to the bureau of the legislative charter or approval specifically |
| 40 | authorizing pulpwood storage at the proposed salvage site; |
| 42 | B. The salvaged pulpwood is to be processed at a mill owned by the person performing the salvage; |

| 14 | FISCAL NOTE |
| 16 | Allowing certain companies to salvage pulpwood from submerged lands owned by the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the |
| 18 | Department of Conservation may result in a loss of dedicated revenues usually generated by the sale of this pulpwood. The |
| 20 | amounts can not be determined at this time. However, the bureau will be compensated for the value of any salvaged pulpwood by |
| 22 | improvements to the property by the involved company. |

| | This bill allows companies previously chartered by the |
| 28 | Legislature to store wood over publicly owned submerged lands to salvage the pulpwood for use in a company-owned facility. |
| 30 | Compensation to the State for the value of the pulpwood is waived as long as the salvage operation results in substantial |
| 32 | improvements to public trust rights. |
