Further amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency clause (page 2, lines 6 and 7 in L.D.)

Current law requires that beginning January 1, 2001, games of chance operated at agricultural fairs must be conducted using tickets or tokens unless the games are conducted by a member of the agricultural fair society or a bona fide nonprofit. The bill would have extended the date by which agricultural fairs must comply with the ticket or token provision to January 1, 2002; the removes that change. The amendment amendment agricultural fairs to use tickets, tokens or cash regardless of who operates the games of chance. The amendment also removes the emergency preamble and emergency clause from the bill. amendment maintains the provision that would make the changes to current law retroactive to January 1, 2001.
