SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 635, L.D. 1815, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Training Requirements for Certain Employees of the Department of Public Safety"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 by striking out all of paragraphs G, H and I and inserting in their place the following:

'G. Security officers of the Bureau of Capital Security, whose law enforcement powers are limited to those specified by Title 25, section 2908;

H. The Chief of the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement; or

I. The State Fire Marshal.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2.

FISCAL NOTE

Exempting certain employees of the Department of Public Safety from the full-time law enforcement officer training requirements will eliminate all General Fund costs to this bill.


SUMMARY
