Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §8306 is enacted to read: 4 §8306. Destruction of foreign pest host material authorized 6 When the director finds that there exists within the State 8 any dangerous plant disease or insect infestation of foreign origin that, in the opinion of the director, is likely to kill or seriously injure forest or shade trees in large numbers or is so 10 localized that immediate control may prevent a large outbreak, 12 the director, after notice and opportunity for a hearing as provided in the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, may order any necessary action including the inspection and destruction or 14 other disposition of any forest or shade trees or parts of any forest or shade trees, including, but not limited to, logs, bark, 16 branches, seeds or scion material, or alternate host materials 18 capable of supporting the disease or insect infestation. 20 SUMMARY 22 This bill specifically authorizes the Director of the Maine Forest Service to address eradication of forest diseases and 24 pests of foreign origin.
