COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \hat{H} " to S.P. 672, L.D. 1875

Whether the revenue increase is to the General Fund, the Highway Fund or Other Special Revenue Funds will depend on the facility being leased.

The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of General Services will realize some minor savings by the elimination of the requirement to seek competitive bids to lease certain state facilities.'

SUMMARY

This amendment provides that, for a facility 5,000 square 14 feet or smaller, the State may lease up to 2,500 square feet of unused space without competitive bidding, including the whole 16 facility if the whole facility is less than 2,500 square feet in size. For a facility between 5,000 and 40,000 square feet, the 18 State may lease up to 50% of the facility without competitive bidding if the space is unused. For facilities over 40,000 20 square feet, the State is limited to leasing 20,000 square feet of space per facility regardless of how much is unused.
