	Sec. 1. Definitions. Resolved: That, as used this resolve,
2	unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

6	1. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services.
8	2. "State property" means the real and personal property described in section 3 of this resolve; and be it further
10	Sec. 2. Authority to lease property. Resolved: That the State, by
12	and through the commissioner, may:
14	1. Lease the interests of the State in state property; and
16	2. Negotiate, draft, execute and deliver any easements or other rights that, in the commissioner's discretion, may
18	contribute to the value of a proposed lease of the State's interest; and be it further
20	Sec. 3. Property interest that may be conveyed. Resolved: That
22	the state property authorized to be leased is the following:
24	That portion of Book 243, Page 197, recorded in the Cumberland County Registry of Deeds, that is determined by the
26	commissioner and the Commissioner of Corrections to be unnecessary to the present or future operation of the Long Creek
28	Youth Development Center.
30	The state property may be leased in whole or in part, at the discretion of the commissioner, subject to such permits or
32	approvals as may be required by law; and be it further
34	Sec. 4. Property to be sold as is. Resolved: That the commissioner may negotiate and execute leases, including ground leases, upon
36	those terms the commissioner considers appropriate; however, the state property must be leased as is, without any representations
38	or warranties; and be it further
40	Sec. 5. Exemptions. Resolved: That any lease pursuant to this resolve is exempt from any statutory or regulatory requirement
42	that the property first be offered to the Maine State Housing Authority or another state or local agency; and be it further

	Sec. 6. Purchase price. Resolved: That the commissioner may
46	list the property for lease with private real estate brokers, solicit bids or enter directly into leases with tenants. The
48	commissioner may reject any offers.
