10	SUMMARY

	This amendment replaces the bill. It clarifies the
14	permitted dissemination of intelligence and investigative information under state law. State agencies that are required by
16	statute to investigate abuse, neglect or exploitation of children or incapacitated or dependent adults are authorized to receive
18	the information for use in such investigations. The Child and Family Services and Child Protection Act, the Maine Revised
20	Statutes, Title 22, chapter 1071, charges the Department of Human Services to investigate child abuse and neglect. The Adult
22	Protective Services Act, Title 22, chapter 958-A, authorizes the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Elder and Adult Services
24	to investigate abuse, neglect and exploitation of incapacitated and dependent adults, and the Department of Behavioral and
26	Developmental Services is charged with that duty with respect to persons with mental retardation and autism.

	The amendment also allows the release of intelligence and
30	investigative information to an accused person or that person's agent or attorney if authorized.
