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

12	The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources will
14	require an annual Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$50,000 for the Integrated Pest Management Fund beginning in
16	fiscal year 2002-03 for the establishment of a competitive grant program to support integrated pest management demonstration
18	projects and for reimbursing members of the newly established Integrated Pest Management Council.
20	The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources
22	estimates that private entities will annually contribute \$50,000 beginning in fiscal year 2002-03 to the Integrated Pest
24	Management Fund to assist in the promotion of integrated pest management programs in the State.
26	The additional costs associated with the need for the
28	University of Maine Cooperative Extension Pest Management Office to work with the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural
30	Resources to administer the Integrated Pest Management Council can be absorbed by the University of Maine System utilizing
32	existing budgeted resources.
34	This bill repeals the section of law that creates the Integrated Pest Management Fund and specifies that a minimum of
36	60% of General Fund revenues received by the fund be granted to the University of Maine Cooperative Extension after an agreement
38	of a work plan. Since the University of Maine Cooperative Extension has not received any General Fund revenue as a direct
40	result of this provision in the past, repealing this section of law is not expected to have a significant impact on the
42	Cooperative Extension Office or the University of Maine System as a whole.'

46	SUMMARY
48	This amendment prohibits the deposit of General Fund money into the Integrated Pest Management Fund and adds a fiscal note
50	to the bill.
