18	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{B} " to S.P. 719, L.D. 1921, Bill, "An
20	Act to Prevent Mercury Emissions when Recycling and Disposing of Motor Vehicles"
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24	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
26	'Resolve, Directing the Department of Environmental Protection to Submit a Plan for Removing Mecury Switches from Automobiles'
28	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the
30	title and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:
32	Sec. 1. Submission of a description and hudget for a program to
34	'Sec. 1. Submission of a description and budget for a program to remove mercury switches from automobiles. Resolved: That the
36	Commissioner of Environmental Protection shall submit a plan to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters that proposes a
38	program for statewide system for the collection, transportation and recycling of mercury switches in automobiles. The goal of
40	the program is to collect and recycle at least 90 pounds of mercury per year from mercury switches removed from automobiles.
42	The plan submitted by the commissioner must include:
44	1. Program description. A detailed description of the program, including a time line showing when the program would be
46	implemented and how long it would be expected to operate; a description of the roles of all the participants, including the
48	department and any private sector participants; a list identifying those private sector participants and their
50	respective roles in the program; a description of the nature and timing of all marketing, educational or technical assistance
52	services associated with the program; identification of the

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specific methods to be used to remove and collect the switches,
including methods to minimize costs associated with the inadvertent collection and handling of nonmercury switches or
devices; the identification of the expected recipient of the collected mercury switches, including a description of the manner
in which those switches will be recycled by that recipient; a description of any technological or engineering obstacles that
substantially affect the cost of the program or reduce the potential benefits of the program; and any other factor critical

12 2. Budget. A budget for the program, including the anticipated start-up costs, capital costs and annual operating
 14 costs for the program; any costs associated with transporting or delivering the collected switches to the recycler; and the source
 16 or sources of revenues to fund the program, including costs incurred by the department and costs incurred by private sector
 18 participants in the program.

20 This plan must be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources 22 matters no later than January 15, 2003. That committee may report out legislation to the First Regular Session of the 121st 24 Legislature to implement a plan for the collection, transportation and recycling of mercury switches in automobiles.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

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'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Environmental Protection will incur some 34 minor additional costs to submit a required plan to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's 36 existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

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This amendment is the minority report of the committee.

This amendment replaces the bill, changes the title of the bill and makes the bill a resolve. The amendment requires the Department of Environmental Protection to submit a plan by January 15, 2003 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters for a program that would establish a system for the collection, transportation and recycling of at least 90 pounds per year of mercury from mercury switches removed from automobiles. The plan

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must include a detailed program description and a program
budget. The committee is authorized to report out legislation during the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature to
implement a plan for the collection, transportation and recycling of mercury switches in automobiles.
