The Legislature will require a General Fund appropriation of \$4,850 in fiscal year 2002-03 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members of the Blue Ribbon Commission to Address the Financing of Long-term Care and to print the required report. The Legislature will incur similar costs in fiscal year 2003-04.

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Authorizing the commission to accept funds from outside sources may result in the collection of additional Other Special Revenue funds. A base allocation of Other Special Revenue funds in the amount of \$500 in fiscal year 2002-03 is included in the resolve in the event such funding is received.

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The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to support the work of the Blue Ribbon Commission to Address the Financing of Long-term Care. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

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## SUMMARY

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This amendment gives Legislators who are members of the commission established in the bill legislative per diem and reimbursement for their expenses. This amendment adds a new appropriations and allocations section to reflect this change.

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This amendment also allows the commission to seek staff assistance from the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis through the Legislative Council.
