Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

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FISCAL NOTE

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The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to periodically report to the Long-term Care Implementation Committee and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment removes from the resolve the provision for a \$1 per hour reimbursement increase for personal care assistant home care services. It requires periodic briefings from the Department of Human Services to the Long-term Care Implementation Committee. It changes the report date from October 1, 2002 to January 15, 2003. It also adds a fiscal note to the resolve.

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
