**FISCAL NOTE** 

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This amendment reduces the General Fund cost of the bill by \$16,762 in fiscal year 2002-03 as a result of the delay in the implementation of this measure until January 1, 2004.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 1449, L.D. 1946

This amendment will require the revision of the Regulation of Employment poster by the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards. The department will require a General Fund appropriation in fiscal year 2003-04 for printing and mailing costs. The amount can not be determined at this time.

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The Maine Fire Protection Services Commission will incur some minor additional costs to review the issue of providing protection to a volunteer firefighter from being disciplined or discharged by an employer as a result of the volunteer firefighter missing work due to the volunteer responding to an emergency and submitting the required report. These costs can be absorbed within the commission's existing budgeted resources.

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## SUMMARY

This amendment delays the implementation of the provisions of that section of Committee Amendment "B" that enacts the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, chapter 7, subchapter IV-C until January 1, 2004 and requires the Maine Fire Protection Services Commission to review this Act and report back to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor matters on February 1, 2003 with its recommendations for changes. This amendment also strikes the appropriations and allocations section since the cost is delayed until fiscal year 2003-04.
