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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1469, L.D. 1970

'FISCAL NOTE

This bill requires school administrative units to allow 4 retired teachers who have returned to work to be eligible for coverage under the group health insurance plan for active 6 teachers in the school administrative unit in which that teacher is working. The additional costs of this state mandate can not 8 be determined at this time. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble, the 2/3 vote of all members elected to each House exempts the 10 State from the constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local costs.

The State Employee Health Plan will realize some minor 14 savings from allowing retired teachers who return to work to choose active health plan status. These savings can not be 16 quantified.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that a retired teacher who returns 22 to work as a teacher under the provision of Public Law 2001, chapter 442 is eligible to participate in the group health 24 insurance plan for active teachers in the school administrative unit in which that teacher is working. The amendment does not affect the ability of a retired teacher, if it is acceptable to 26 the teacher and the new employer, to remain in the group health 28 insurance plan under which that teacher retired pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13451, including state payment of a percentage of the cost of that teacher's 30 health insurance premium. The amendment also adds a mandate 32 preamble and a fiscal note to the bill.
