COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1473, L.D. 1974

Sec. 2. Authority to report out legislation. Resolved: That the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 2 over natural resources matters may report out legislation to the 4 First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature to establish a statewide household hazardous waste and universal waste 6 collection program and to provide funding for the operating costs of the program.' 8

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 10 summary the following:

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'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Environmental Protection will incur some 16 minor additional costs to submit a required report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's 18 existing budgeted resources.

20 The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and the State Planning Office within the Executive Department will 22 incur some minor additional costs to work with the Department of Environmental Protection on the development of a proposal to 24 establish a statewide household hazardous waste and universal waste collection program. These costs can be absorbed within the 26 departments' existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

32 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. It directs the Department of Environmental Protection to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 34 natural resources matters by January 15, 2003 on the feasibility and design of a funding mechanism for the operational costs of a 36 waste and statewide household hazardous universal waste collection program. The amendment also allows the committee to 38 report out legislation establishing and funding such a program to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature. It also adds 40 a fiscal note to the bill.
