44	This bill would require school boards to adopt policies and
46	procedures to address student threats. There would be no fiscal impact to the Department of Education if this legislation were enacted.

50	The requirement that school boards adopt policies to address student threats represents a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. The additional local costs are estimated
52	to be minor since most school administrative units already have,

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or are in the process of, adopting policies. Unless General Fund
appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and
2/3 of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, the school administrative units may not
be required to implement these changes.'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It replaces the bill and adds the words "threatening" to the list of types of behaviors that would require policies and procedures to be established for removing a student from the classroom.

16 It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
