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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "S" to H.P. 1474, L.D. 1975

The requirement that school boards amend the student code of conduct to adopt policies and procedures to address student threats of death or bodily harm represents a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. The additional local costs are estimated to be minor since most school administrative units already have, or are in the process of adopting, policies. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and 2/3 of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, the school administrative units may not be required to implement these changes.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It adds the phrase "students threatening death or bodily harm to others" to the list of types of behaviors in the student code of conduct that would require policies and procedures to be established for removing a student from the classroom. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
